

# LAST CHANCE FOR LAMBERT

**Lawyer Semple Will Try to Get the Pardon Board to Act.**

The next regular meeting of the New Jersey Board of Pardons is fixed for Thursday, the day set for the execution of Theodore Lambert in Camden. The board meets in Jersey City. Lawyer Semple, counsel for Lambert, said last night that he would endeavor to get the board to meet at an earlier date and consider Lambert's case. He believes it would be useless to again apply to Governor Werts for a respite.

The condemned man does not seem to realize that he has less than three days to live. He had his photograph taken yesterday. The report that he passes his time playing cards with his death watch, he says, is untrue, as he has not touched cards since he was converted.

Notices will be sent out to-day by Sheriff Barrett to persons selected to witness the execution. The scaffold will probably be erected to-morrow.
