

MURDERER GIVEN TALKING MACHINE

Woodward, Condemned Boy Slay-
er, Operates Phonograph in
the County Jail

IS HAVING LOTS OF FUN

Familiar Strains Ring Through the
Cells to Youthful Prisoner's Great
Delight

Paul Woodward, sentenced to be hanged on January 7 in the Camden jail, asked permission of Sheriff Mines to have a talking machine in "Hangman's Row" so that his fellow-prisoners might not be annoyed by his attempts to perform on a whistle and harmonica.

The request was granted. Last night the strains of "Lead, Kindly Light," and "Abide With Me," followed by a number of Sousa's marches rang through the jail. The prisoners joined in the chorus of the songs. The condemned man got a whole lot of delight out of the phonograph, which he manipulated until a late hour.
