

OVER IN CAMDEN.

* The Camden police say that the woman who claimed to have been stood up for \$3 by a policeman is an adventuress and her story is untrue.

* On a complaint made by James M. Scovel, John Gallester, a Gloucester saloon-keeper, was held in \$200 bail by Justice Wells yesterday for selling liquor illegally.

* A crank came to the Camden police headquarters yesterday and announced that he was Robert Jones Monaghan, the missing West Chester lawyer. The police fired him out.

* The damage suits against Policemen Thomas and Sage for false arrest brought in the Camden District Court by Messrs. Jones and Nokes were decided in favor of the policemen yesterday.

* Lawyer John Roberts, John Van Sciver and a friend, while canoeing on the Delaware, near Pavonia, capsized and came near being drowned. They were saved by the workmen at the Camden Water Works.

* The body of the 8-year-old boy found drowned in the Delaware at Pavonia was identified yesterday as James Bell, of 401 Lander street, Philadelphia, who went in swimming at Spruce street wharf and was drowned.

* Camden Republicans allege that the Democrats in the Second Assembly district are padding the registry lists. The fiercest contest in the coming election will be in this district, and the Democrats are making desperate efforts to carry it.

* The Democratic County License Commissioners, after a mysterious secret meeting last night, announced that no action had been taken on applications for licenses or transfers. This non-committal action is said to have been taken in order to affect the coming elections.
