WOODWARD'S LAST SUNDAY ON EARTH

Listens to Religious Services in
Jail and Threatens to "Call
Down" Ministers

Paul Woodward, who has but two days more before he will be hanged for the murder of John Coffin and W. Price Jennings, spent his last Sunday in his cell at the county jail in Camden reading and smoking. He listened to the devotional services held in another part of the jail with apparent interest, but remarked: "If those preachers say anything about me I'll call them down." Woodward ate an enormous dinner ordered from a near-by restaurant, consisting of stewed chicken, fried oysters, rolls, coffee and other things.

The authorities seem to be of the opinion that Woodward will create a scene when he goes to the gallows next Wednesday. He is in much better physical condition than the day he was first incarcerated for his terrible crime, and unless all signs fail he will go to his death without being "carried on a chair," as he recently remarked.
